
The India in 2047 - National Case Competition is a first of its kind business case contest.

THE 2023 CASE: THE SATYAM'S 100 DAYS TURNAROUND

The 2023 edition centered on "Satyam's 100-Day Turnaround," inspired by the book "Tech Phoenix: Satyam's 100-day Turnaround" co-authored by T N Manoharan, a pivotal figure in Satyam's revival, and V Pattabhi Ram. The Contest Process

Keynote address



T N Manoharan, Padma Shri Awardee, Chairman. IDBI Bank

Yet, amidst this turbulence, the keynote underscored a narrative of collective fortitude and tenacity. While lauding the government board's commendable efforts, the unsung heroes emerged—the steadfast Satyam employees who weathered the storm with unwavering resolve.

Recognized for commendable work pre-scandal, the workforce's post-revival transformation was nothing short of exceptional. Clients hailed their steadfast commitment, reflecting a deep dedication to resuscitating Satyam from the brink.

Amidst governance failure emerged a phoenix—the revival that earned Manoharan the esteemed Padma Shri award. This recognition underscored the collaborative endeavour that rescued Satyam from the abyss.

The keynote illuminated Satyam's narrative—a testament to human toughness, the perils of unchecked greed, and the potency of unity. It urged attendees not just to acknowledge the fall but also to celebrate the rise an epitome of human dedication and steadfast commitment against all odds.

Our unique ability to relate and connect cannot be taken away by AI or technology; it can only be enhanced. As future leaders, I urge you to cherish this aspect of human connection. As you progress professionally, nurture and build these connections. Continue making real connections, staying in touch, and meeting people. This will help us build a better tomorrow together.

Many of you might be familiar with the Self-Made man sculpture. I'd like to rename it the self-made person. The sculpture, created by artist Bobbie Carlyle, symbolizes the individual who carves their future from the stone from which they emerge. We continuously carve ourselves to be better every day. Your generation surpasses mine, and the next will surpass yours. This constant spirit of progress will propel us forward.

In the next 25 years, you'll be blessed with increasing power: the power to transform, recreate, voice opinions, and shape ideas. Just imagine what marvels Edison or Einstein could have created with today's technological advances. You will wield similar power. But remember, with great power comes great responsibility. As future leaders, you'll have the ability to make choices. I'm hopeful and confident that when you reach that stage, you'll make the right choices, driving our country forward in its own unique way. Find the balance between humanity and productivity, costs and compassion, action and serendipity, and between Machine Intelligence and Human Inspiration.

Allow me to conclude by quoting Adi Shankaracharya: "We are not our intellect, memory, organs, ego, body, emotions, identity, vices, or deeds. We are consciousness."

May everything you aspire to do be an expression of the divine consciousness omnipresent in each of us.

Keynote address



V P Joy, Senior Executive Vice President, Reliance Industries Ltd.

V P Joy, a respected name in education sector and a fervent advocate for writing, skill development, and entrepreneurship, painted a vibrant portrait of youth as the linchpin in steering India's destiny. His narrative unfolded through a lens reflecting his own journey, linking it to the theme 'India in 2047'.

Originating from a humble rural backdrop, Joy underscored that beyond lineage and circumstances, the driving forces to achieve aspirations are passion and values. Drawing upon his expansive 47-year voyage encompassing diverse learning and professional stints post-schooling, he echoed the transformative influence of visionary leaders from the three organisations he worked with - Federal Bank, ICFAI, and RIL.. He acknowledged Shri N J Yasaswy for broadening his horizons and imprinting invaluable lessons during a pivotal phase of his career.

Diving into the complexity of today's interconnected world, Joy outlined interdependence of individuals, families, institutions, and nations. For India's potential leap, facilitated by demographics and technology, he stressed the indispensable ingredients: effective execution, unwavering efforts, values-driven strategies, and inclusive development. Referring to the popular advertisement tagline, 'Indian at Heart. Global in Spirit', he urged all to also be 'Universal in Ethos'.

Central to his vision was empowering the youth to be architects of a formidable India by evolving into their finest versions. Therefore, his take is that the focus should be more on 'Indians in 2047' than 'India in 2047'.

He championed the cultivation of both performance and moral character for success, citing insights from 'How Children Succeed' by Paul Tough. His roadmap advocated a dedication to lifelong learning, a culture fostering innovation, and mastery in one's domain.

Joy's discourse exalted resourcefulness, interdisciplinary approaches, and the fusion of academia with industry. He extolled the pivotal role of productivity, hunger for knowledge, and the nurturing of a vibrant start-up ecosystem.

He evoked the spirit of 'loonshot thinking' from Safi Bahcall's book, Loonshots: How to Nurture the Crazy Ideas, endorsing it as a catalyst for groundbreaking innovations. His optimism shone through in India's National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, deeming it a potential game-changer if embraced wholeheartedly by all stakeholders.

Viewing a developed nation through the lens of education, he spoke of how freedom of career choice is should be unbounded by constraints. Reflecting on his journey, he emphasized that while a good formal education lays the groundwork for an excellent start, the self-taught, driven individual can surpass norms in the marathon of a career.

He concluded by saying that India in 2047 is a work-in-progress and the nation should revisit the progress made every few years and take new directions and give a new momentum as required, with the youth taking the lead.




